

MESSAGE FROM OUR CEO

May of 2021 marked Meritan's 60th anniversary. I do not think anyone could have predicted a full year of operating under a pandemic. While COVID-19 brought many challenges, it has also allowed us opportunities to better serve our communities. Our home health staff worked diligently with the Shelby County Health Department and other agencies to provide free COVID testing. As soon as vaccination became available, we mobilized our staff and many volunteers to assist with community vaccination efforts. We began in December of 2020 by staffing mass vaccination clinics and in March we started COVID vaccinations for Shelby, Tipton, Fayette, and Lauderdale counties for homebound adults. Those vaccination efforts continue to this day and now include COVID-19 boosters, flu shots and monoclonal antibodies. To date, we have administered over 1,000 vaccines to the most vulnerable in our community. This was made possible in part by grants from the Tennessee Association for Homecare. and the Aging Commission of the Mid-South.

Meritan never ceased providing any of our services during the past year. Foster care, residential supports, home health care, senior employment, and in-home support continued. Clinical assessments, emergency housing, and other services were provided to victims of elder abuse. Sadly we have seen the numbers of abuse cases rise as pandemic restrictions began to lift. We are thankful for our partners, the Family Safety Center of Memphis and Shelby County, Tennessee Adult Protective Services, Memphis Police and Fire Departments, Shelby County Sheriff and Fire Departments, the Community Legal Center, and other local agencies who collaborate with us to provide victims of elder abuse the wrap-around services they need.

Throughout the year we successfully served all of our individuals while maintaining appropriate precautions. Our COVID committee continues to meet weekly, review the most recent pandemic-associated information and track COVID cases of staff, family members, and those we support. Our data reflects our diligence and infection control efforts have paid off. The agency has found 0% COVID transmission between staff and those receiving services.

Meritan staff have risen to the challenge and excelled during the most difficult of times. Their dedication and compassion continue to inspire me. Of course, we could not do what we do without the help of our community. We are grateful to our grant funders, including the Assisi Foundation, City of Memphis, Shelby County, the United Way of the Mid South, the Aging Commission of the Mid-South, Nike, and other entities who have provided grants to continue our operations. Our senior employment host agencies worked with us to ensure the safety of our older workers. Individuals contributed financially, adopted Silver Bells at the holidays, sponsored foster children at Christmas, wrote letters to our homebound seniors and so much more. Thank you so much for your support!

Over the past year, we have learned what it means to be resilient. We know for certain that we are all in this together. We also know that together we are stronger and we can make a difference. We look forward to the next 60 years of serving our community with quality and compassionate services.



Home Health

Served 519 clients in their homes with services such as wound care, physical therapy, occupational therapy and more.



Beginning March 16, 2020, until June 30, 2020, administered 431 COVID vaccinations to homebound clients in Shelby, Tipton, Lauderdale, and Fayette counties in West Tennessee.



Senior Employment

Provided 154 low-income senior citizens with on-the-job training and career services with 36 receiving new permanent positions.



Foster Care

Provided 205 children in foster care in Tennesse, Arkansas, and Georgia with homes of refuge and health with over 1,460,000 hours of service.



Intellectual & Developmental Disabilities

Provided 23 adults living with developmental and intellectual disabilities residential home placement with 24/hr, 7 days a week care.



Homemaker Services

Served 237 low-income homebound elderly and/or disabled clients.



Elder Abuse

Provided services such as medical assessments, housing, and homemaker services to 35 victims of elder abuse in the Memphis/Shelby County metro area.
